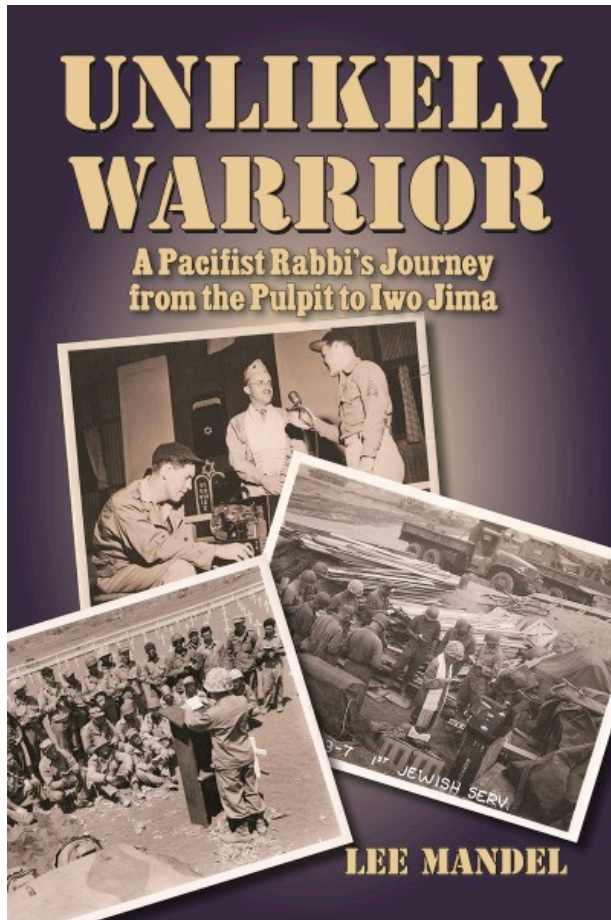


Unlikely Warrior: A Pacifist Rabbi's Journey from the Pulpit to Iwo Jima

A brilliant student, orator, and debater, Rabbi Roland Gittelsohn was an outspoken social activist and frequent lecturer on political topics in the 1930s. Despite his passionate support of pacifism, Gittelsohn voluntarily joined the US Navy when the United States entered the war, becoming the first Jewish chaplain ever assigned to the United States Marine Corps. Gittelsohn's remarkable story, told here from his surviving notes, chronicles the evolution of his crisis of conscience, and gives an insider's view into the Battle of Iwo Jima. Author Lee Mandel's research provides an unprecedented look at how the US Navy took clergymen of all religions and molded them into a highly effective support force for America's fighting forces.

Mandel traces the Gittelsohn family from their emigration from Russia through Roland's ordination and his excursions into the political and Zionist movements that shaped the 1930s. Delving into Gittelsohn's pivotal decision to join the armed forces as a chaplain and his experiences in battle, Mandel details the behind-the-scenes anti-Semitic power struggles that almost prevented what was to become one of the most famous oratories in military history. At the dedication of the Fifth Marine Division cemetery, Gittelsohn delivered a eulogy now known as "The Purest Democracy" and often referred to as "The Gettysburg Address of World War II." In this dramatic narrative, Mandel draws from many historical sources, including Gittelsohn's 1988 autobiography, extensive personal papers, and the rabbi's unpublished war memoir- including his analysis of why pacifism failed- to present a complete picture of this unusual man.



Lee Mandel is a retired US Navy physician and writer. A frequently invited lecturer, he has appeared twice on the History Channel in conjunction with his research on John F. Kennedy. His first book, *Moryak: A Novel of the Russian Revolution*, was the grand prize winner for historical fiction at the Santa Fe Creative Arts Council in 2010. His son Jeff is an aviator in the US Navy and his daughter Jennifer is an assistant district attorney in Nassau County, NY. Lee and his wife Ann live in Suffolk, VA.
